


### **Hot spots heatin' up Splitters may be chillin', but it's hot**





A typical Friday night is about to begin. Students will attend the Varsity game, then carry their enthusiasm to their favorite "Hot Spot".


The party network busily arranges to "party proof" (remove all valuables and fragile items to a safe place) the home of the chosen victim.


## Senior Officers Of 89 Work To Boost "Splitter Spirit"


*Being a senior isn't all excitement.*



















There were two awards given this year: Most Valuable Runner given to seniors, Captain Lori Viterna and Most Improved Runner given to freshman Sara Pasky.







## Swimmers Fight For A Better Year





## Determined And Ready




Rah! Rah! Rah!- Jumping, shouting and smiling kept the Varsity Cheerleaders energized during the 88-89 Basketball season.





As well as many teams this year, the Varsity Volleyball team has a new coach for their 88/89 season.









This year's team ended their season with awards going to junior Shannon Addington for Most Improved, and junior Willie Brunty for Most Valuable.







They certainly lived up to their motto which is, "Powered by pride, driven by desire."




## Lincoln's Pride






## Teamwork builds skills & confidence


















The strive for excellence continued for the LHS select Choir as they prepared for the Lancing trip in June.


Seniors Che Phillips, Julie Johnson and Matt Mellendorf comprised the French IV class taught by Ms. Kish.





### RIF draws support from staff, students, and local businesses

"RIF's great because students get to pick books they want to read," said librarian Anitra Gordon. "The federal government pays about  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the cost, and local companies donate the rest."


Our principal, Dr. Kratz, didn't have an opinion on his principal, "I never met him because our school was so large. My graduating class consisted of 930 students."


## Commencement Emphasizes Future


